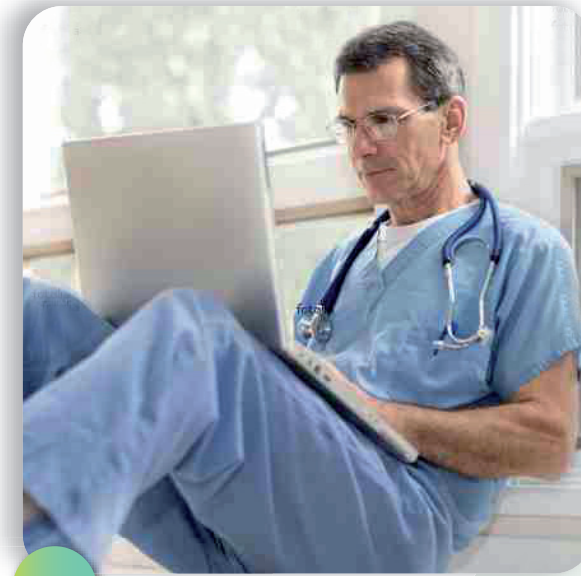

## Who we are

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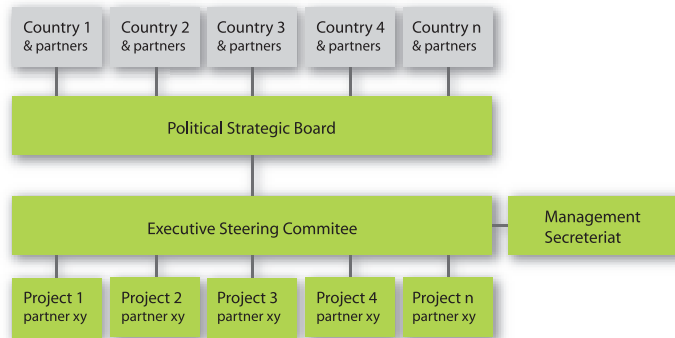
The eHealth for Regions network facilitates transnational cooperation on health in the Baltic Sea Region. eHealth is a core facilitator for cooperation between the international partners and an important cornerstone in the European strategy for the Baltic Sea Region.

**Political Strategic Board (PSB):** Representatives of the highest political level in the regions decide on strategic guidelines and set the deployment of eHealth in motion.

**Executive Steering Committee (ESC):** Representatives of the network partners prepare the decisions of the PSB and support actively the progress of the network projects.

**Management Secretariat:** Day-to-day management

The network has its origin in the transnational project with the same name "eHealth for Regions". The project ran from June 2004 until May 2007 and was part-financed by the European Union within the frame of the Baltic Sea Region INTERREG III B-programme.



## What we do

### What we do

The eHealth for Regions network brings telemedicine experts from several health and IT-branches together in order to establish new ways in cross-border healthcare in the Baltic Sea Region. The network wants

- to increase awareness and acceptance of eHealth by citizens, medical professionals and further stakeholders in the regions.
- to compare and benchmark the eHealth performance in the regions transnationally.
- to connect complementary expertise and knowledge for better quality of health care services for the citizens.
- to jointly use medical, technological and educational resources and capacities for better costefficiency in the regions.
- to improve the availability and accessibility of health care services.
- to foster mutual access to regional health care markets.

In the future the eHealth for Regions network will develop new projects to implement the European eHealth strategy in the Baltic Sea Region.

The network is already established as an expert group in the Northern Dimension Partnership in Public Health and Social Well-being.

The eHealth for Regions network offers its members and interested eHealth experts a forum to share their experiences and ideas.



The network members can find working results, eHealth news, calls and tenders on a web-based collaboration platform.

The network members cooperate transnationally within joint projects. They develop new ideas, search for partners inside and outside the network and apply for public funding.

To raise awareness of eHealth solutions in the Baltic Sea region the network carries out four Virtual Seminars during the year. eHealth experts from partner institutions and organisations present current research and project results.
